



## Compostable Bag Vendors

As part of your commercial organics recycling program – you must use compostable bags. The use of plastic or ‘degradable’ bags are not allowed as they do not break down in the composting process. Use of compostable bags keeps recycling bins, carts and dumpsters cleaner.

Bags that are certified by the Biodegradable Products Institute (BPI) – third party certification organization – are required.

Bags that are labeled as ‘degradable’, ‘biodegradable’, or ‘made from plants’ are not compostable. Rather, they break down into smaller pieces of plastic, which contaminate the finished compost.
